Strategic Planning (2016-2021): Apropos its SWOC analysis and institutional goals, the university devised a detailed strategic planning framework for accomplishing the intended goals. Following are the salient parameters and action plan thereof which the university adopted during the period of assessment.

Teaching Learning Process: Owing to its mandate of women empowerment through quality education and societal growth through community engagement, the university planned its activities pertaining to teaching and learning in a systematic and holistic manner. The key points of planning have been:

- preparation of Academic Calendar well in adherence and its adherence
- developing lesson plans in accordance with the programme & course outcomes
- use of ICT and digital pedagogical tools
- involving faculty in developing e-learning resources
- fostering research culture and provision of related facilities
- counseling and mentoring for learners
- effective feedback system for both teachers and learners
- * revision of curriculums by incorporating contemporary needs

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- # effective and transparent process of continuous evaluation through internal and external assessment
- adopting good practices like CBCS etc.

Leadership and Participative Management: The University has been functioning with active participation of all the concerned stakeholders. The university could establish an effective interface between the leadership and staff by keeping the following action points in mind while planning:

- decentralization of various academic and non-academic activities
- well laid out rules and regulations, responsibility and accountability
- # judicious distribution of roles and duties, constitution of various committees
- actionable system for staff feedback
- participation of society's representatives

Internal Quality Assurance System: in order to ensure qualitative delivery of its services to the learners and society at large, the university has put in place an IQAS, which is mandated to:

- conduct training programmes for staff and all concerned
- 4 advising the university authorities on maintenance of quality standards in university academic & social life
- periodic audit of various university activities
- preparing the university for assessment and accreditation

Good Governance: The University being a model of university-society interface and because of its genesis in being created through philanthropic means, functions in participatory mode leading to better mechanism for governance, which includes the following:

- # ensuring participation of eminent experts in all governing bodies of the university
- self Evaluation of the university and setting the benchmark
- promotion of E-governance
- preparing young faculty for leadership roles
- promoting and ensuring transparency in university's activities

Student's Development, Welfare and Participation: The University ensures students' participation in its governance and areas of students' welfare through: whell.

- provision of budget for students' development activities
- training & placement of students

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Institute – Industry Interaction: The University has been active on maintaining industry-institute interface by having:

- MoUs with institutes and organizations of repute
- Sponsoring educational & professional development trips and visits to industry
- Incorporating industry needs in the curricula
- Providing assistance to students for placements and career guidance through university's UPAAC
- Establishing special centers in collaboration with professional houses like Ericcson etc.

Entrepreneurship: BPSMV has been making serious efforts to promote entrepreneurial skills in its students. The university initiated the following steps during the assessment period:

- # provided training and guidance to students for fostering entrepreneurial skills
- conducted extension lectures and workshops on related subjects
- made Efforts to establish incubation centre

Research and Innovation: The University has been making concerted efforts to promote quality research and innovation especially in areas of societal growth and community engagement. The following steps have been initiated:

- research policy of the university framed
- PhD in several subjects offered
- M.Phil in education, English and Commerce offered
- Students are made to think innovatively through research projects and dissertation during their PG
- conduct of workshops, seminars and FDPs for faculty
- Financial and academic assistance provided by the university to the faculty for undertaking research innovations
- preservation and propagation of Indian knowledge systems and practices

Internal Revenue Generation: Because of its genesis in being created through philanthropic means, the university is an example of socially driven movement. It has been getting financial support from society and governments. However the university made efforts to generate revenue through:

teacher training programmes for the teachers sponsored by the State government

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- in house preparation and sale of ayurvedic pharmaceutical traditional medicines like Chavanprash
- FLDC (Indo-Israel project on vegetables)
- paperless digital university initiatives
- production of electrical energy through solar panels
- auction of university land on lease for agricultural purpose

Community Services and Outreach Activities: Society-University interface being the core idea, on which BPSMV has been created, societal growth has always been the focal point for the university. The university undertakes several activities in this regard, a few of them are as following:

- adoption of villages in the vicinity
- creation of self help groups (SHGs) consisting of rural women
- conduct of awareness campaigns, camps and nukkad nataks on issue of concern to the rural population
- Sarathi Project for teaching driving to the rural women (an initiative of UNDP and Hero Motocorp)
- counseling sessions for local community on remedial measures for their problems
- services rendered by students' through NSS & NCC

Alumni Interaction: The University has a strong community of its alumni, which represent every section of society and professional life. In order to have an active interaction with the alumni, the university has

- established alumni cell in the university
- created a digital platform for sustained enrolment and interaction with the alumni
- formed departmental and central committee to oversee and coordinate activities pertaining to alumni
- created corpus fund for the alumni
- institutionalized a mechanism for seeking alumni contribution
- sought alumni help in being its brand ambassadors

Infrastructure: Since its inception as a university, BPSMV has been expanding on all fronts, including the infrastructure. The university added the following to its existing infrastructure:

- constructed new library building
- new building for regional centre and south campus
- * renovation of teaching blocks, faculty houses, hostels and other student facilities
- construction of sports complex and amenities
- Strengthening print and ebooks

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- ICT enabled smart class rooms
- upgrade of Laboratory & equipment
- plantation drives
- provision of Rain water harvesting facility
- plastic free & green campus

Financial Management: The University through its accounts branch manages income and expenditure policies. The finance committee of the university plans, prepares and executes financial needs of the university. The rules and protocol on purchase of items and utilization of funds have been put in place and are strictly adhered to. The local audit team stationed in the university conducts periodic audit of the university's finances.

BPSMV has the distinction of having its roots in Vedic Guruul Parampara and emerged as the unique model of tradition-technology and modernity committed to help the rural women in fulfilling their dreams and aspirations.
