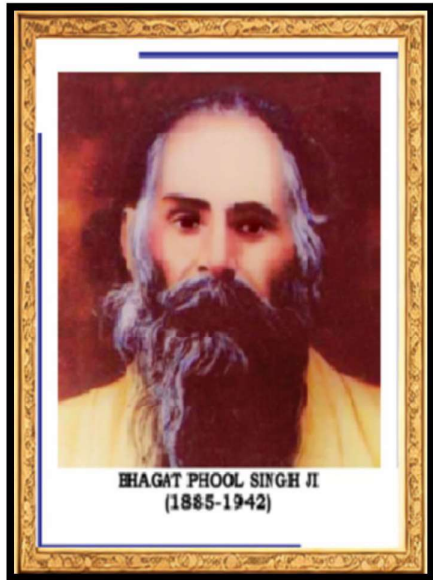

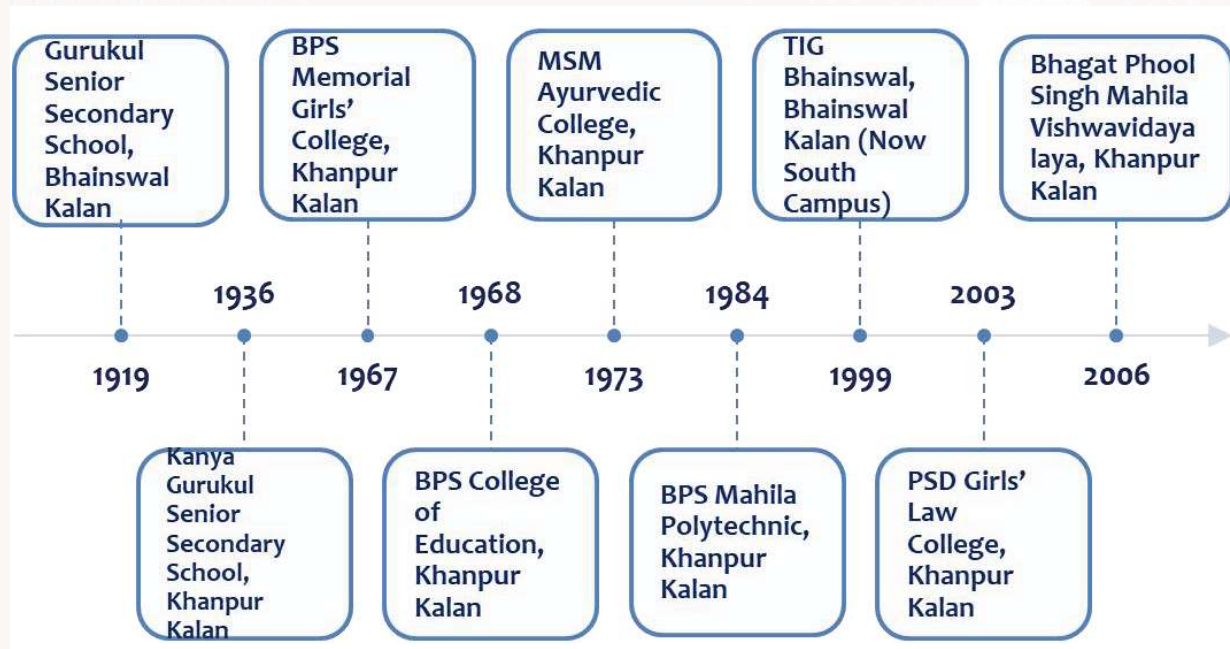

SECTION – I

Brief Introduction

The seed of today's Bhagat Phool Singh Mahila Vishwavidyalaya (BPSMV) was sown way back in the year 1936. The journey began with the establishment of a Girls' Gurukul with three girls in the first batch at Khanpur Kalan by revered Bhagat Phool Singh Ji (1885-1942) whose seminal idea of 'empowering women through education' was a revolutionary progressive giant step. The idea in fact could be termed as a precursor to today's 'Beti Bachao Beti Padhao' campaign. The erstwhile Gurukul established purely through philanthropic means, not only expanded but also became a sought after centre of higher learning and education for girls. Bhagat Phool Singh Ji's vision and the hard work done by his daughter Padamshree Subhashini turned the Gurukul into a premier institution modelled on Indian values and ethos. It was in August 2006, the Government of Haryana thought of giving a firm shape to the idea conceived by Bhagat Phool Singh Ji and upgraded the Gurukul and its constituent institutions to a women's university mandated to further the original idea of Bhagat Phool Singh ji; "Women Empowerment Through Education". Since then BPSMV has expanded on all fronts and offers a range of academic job oriented programmes touching almost all aspects of life and career. Establishment of University's two Regional Centres at Kharal (Jind) and Krishan Nagar (Rewari) and affiliation of 05 women colleges with BPSMV is the testimony of its commitment and growing stature. BPSMV enjoys the distinction of being a university practicing 'University Society Interface' through community engagement, which is its core strength.

- The university has established state-of-the-art language laboratory (LRC).
- The University Centre for Judicial Services (UCJS) has been established in the Department of Laws to prepare young law graduates for judiciary.
- University Centre for Competitive Examinations has been established on the University campus for providing coaching and guidance at very nominal cost.
- The first University to establish a Centre for Society University Interface and Research (CSUIR).
- BPSMV offers facility to join NSS and NCC units and excellent facility for various sports and games.
- In order to offer skills' development opportunities to university girls and rural women from neighboring villages, Hero MotoCorp in collaboration with UNDP has established Driving School on the university campus.
- In order to provide entrepreneurship opportunities, UNDP has established Centre for Skills Development in Stitching at BPSMV for university students and rural women from the nearby villages.
- Through its Placement and Counseling Cell, the university provides placement assistance to the meritorious students especially of the professional courses. The companies are invited to the campus for placement drives.

Special Centres

- **Centre for Society University Interface and Research (CSUIR):** CSUIR was established in August 2010 with an aim to bridge the disconnection between University and society. It organizes courses and activities which are of direct relevance to the rural community and to formulate schemes that recover traditional good agricultural practices, sustain and conserve the vast knowledge reservoir of rural women.
- **The Vishwavidyalaya Swavlamban Kendra (VSK):** Vishwavidyalaya Swavlamban Kendra (VSK) is the flagship nodal centre of Bhagat Phool Singh Mahila Vishwavidyalaya, established in alignment with the National Education Policy 2020 and the vision of Aatmanirbhar Bharat to advance self-reliance, skill development, entrepreneurship, innovation, and industry-academia integration. As a women-centric platform, VSK operationalises employability-linked education, skill development training, micro-credentials, and start-up support for students, scholars, faculty, and affiliated institutions, with a clear commitment to enabling economic independence, social contribution, and leadership among women.

The Kendra functions through four dedicated divisions, each supported by a Core Team and a faculty representative from every department of the University: Career & Placement Assistance, which leads industry liaison, placement drives, internships, and career counselling through Training & Placement Officers in each Department; Entrepreneurship, Incubation and Startup, which provides ideation support, incubation, mentorship, and innovation facilitation for student-led ventures; Higher Education & Research, which guides students in fellowships, competitive examinations, research aptitude, and academic writing; and Skill Development and Training, which delivers employability, digital, and life-skill programmes that complement academic learning. Together, these divisions form a full-spectrum support system that accompanies every student through her transition from learner to professional, entrepreneur, or researcher.

- Central Library:** The Central Library, established in 2007, is a fully air-conditioned facility serving as the primary hub for information resources and e-access supporting teaching and research at BPSMV. It houses over 17,000 books, while the total collection across the University including Regional Centres, Departments, Colleges/Institutes, Centers, Schools etc. exceeds 1,43,500. The Library provides extensive access to e-resources under the One Nation One Subscription (ONOS) Scheme, offering more than 13,000 reputed journals across multiple disciplines. As a result, print journals are subscribed to only when titles are not covered under ONOS. Additionally, the remote access facility enables users to access e-resources anytime, anywhere, on any device. A Digital Library with 120 computers and seating capacity of over 180 users has also been established for enhanced academic support. The Library is equipped with internet and Wi-Fi connectivity and offers a range of services, including reference, reprography, database access, internet browsing and other e-services. It has been a member of INFLIBNET, DELNET and the National Digital Library (NDL). The Library also contributes to Shodhganga and Shodh Sindhu and uses DrillBit Plagiarism Detection Software to maintain academic integrity. The infrastructure includes a computer lab, Inter-Library Loan (ILL) facility and an Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC). All operations are automated using KOHA Library Management Software, compatible with RFID technology, with CCTV surveillance installed for security.
- UGC-Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Center (UGC-MMTTC):** The Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Centre (MMTTC) at Bhagat Phool Singh Mahila Vishwavidyalaya (BPSMV), Khanpur Kalan erstwhile Human Resource Development Centre is a vibrant academic hub dedicated to strengthening the professional capacities of teachers in higher education. Established under the flagship initiative of the University Grants Commission (UGC), the centre works with a clear vision to empower educators with updated knowledge, innovative pedagogies and a strong value-based approach to teaching and learning towards a gender just society.

At MMTTC BPSMV, faculty development is not seen as a one-time activity but as a continuous journey. The centre regularly organizes Gurudakshta-Faculty Induction Programmes (FIPs), Refresher Courses, Short-Term Courses, NEP-2020 sensitisation and Orientation Workshops and interdisciplinary workshops aligned with the goals of the National Education Policy 2020. These programmes are carefully designed to blend subject knowledge with emerging trends such as digital learning, research methodologies, academic leadership, Bhartiye Knowledge Systems (IKS) and human values.

Its learner-centric and participative approach makes it distinctive. Sessions are interactive and experiential, encouraging dialogue, reflection, and based on practical application. It attracts nationwide participation, bringing together educators from across the country and fostering a rich environment of academic exchange. The centre regularly engages eminent resource persons, including leading academicians & administrators, policy makers, industry experts ensuring high-quality learning experiences and to ensure quality exposure and diverse perspectives. The centre also emphasizes the integration of ethics, inclusivity, sustainability, and holistic education in teaching practices.

With a visionary and learner-centric approach, the centre has benefitted approximately 7,500 participants to date. It also actively contributes to enhancing women's participation in faculty development initiatives, reflecting the university's commitment to empowerment and inclusivity. It continues to play a vital role in shaping the future of higher education by promoting excellence, innovation, and continuous professional growth among teachers. This centre stands as a centre of academic enrichment committed to building educators who inspire, innovate, and lead.

- **Sports Facilities:** The directorate of sports at BPSMV offers a range of sports activities to university students and trains them in sports like wrestling, boxing, kabaddi etc. The University has participated in national sports events like Khelo India, All India Kabadi Championship and All India Inter University Wrestling Championship. The University has secured 54th rank in Khelo India games and 7th rank in the All India Inter University Wrestling Championship. Besides excelling in sports, the directorate of sports motivates and trains students for jobs in Railways, CISF, Income- Tax department, State Police. Several of our students have in fact secured jobs in the said organizations.
- **Learning Resource Centre:** Learning Resource Centre (LRC) is an autonomous central facility of the University housing audio-video language laboratories, Staff Training and Research Institute for Teaching of English (STRITE), theatre, conference hall, smart classroom, and library. Besides its primary role of imparting communication skills' training to the students of the university, LRC imparts training & guidance for appearing in international English proficiency examinations, Business English Certificate (BEC), IELTS and TOEFL and had the privilege of hosting American ELT interns in the past. STRITE has been established for imparting training in effective teaching of English & operation of language laboratory to school & college teachers. So far ten teacher training programmes have been conducted through STRITE benefiting teachers sponsored by the State Government.
- **University Centre for Competitive Examinations (UCCE) :** The Centre has been established for imparting coaching and guidance to students of the University, affiliated and maintained colleges and other educational institutions for various competitive examinations and to prepare them to face interviews and improve communication skills.

Subhashini Devi Research Chair: “The Subhashini Devi Chair” has been established in Bhagat Phool Singh Mahila Vishwavidyalaya via resolution no. 22 in the 77th meeting of the Executive council on 08/12/23.

The Research Chair has been established with the objectives such as - to conduct research on the life of BPSMV’S revered founders Bhagat Phool Singh Ji and Behan Subhashini Devi Ji; to critically study and analyze the philosophy propounded and practiced by Behan Subhashini Devi Ji; to study the influence of Arya Samaj and other social reformers on Bhagat Phool Singh Ji and Behan Subhashini Devi Ji; to study the *Gurukul Parampara* and its relevance in modern times; to study the concept of *Jan Bhagidari* and its applicability as society-university interface; to prepare and publish monographs on the founders; to create a corpus of video interviews and recordings; to start academic programmes on the life and philosophy of Bhagat Phool Singhji and Behan Subhashini Devi Ji; to disseminate their philosophy through various events followed by publication of books and proceedings; to start online academic programmes on key tenets of *Gurukul Parampara* for foreign students; to prepare academic assignments for the in-house students to undertake; to conduct intra-university and inter-university competitions on the relevant themes; to sign MOUs with the women institutions established on the similar lines and working towards women empowerment; to prepare a participatory website; to conduct lectures and expert talks by inviting experts; to undertake other activities suggested by the Advisory Committee from time to time.

So far, apart from various students’ activities in the university for the awareness/propagation of the founders’ ideals, the Chair has published 3 books and organized 3 Symposiums. The Chair also started Annual Magazine *Subhashitaa* of which two issues have been successfully published.

National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The National Cadet Corps (NCC) was established at Bhagat Phool Singh Mahila Vishwavidyalaya in 2018 with the allotment of 54 government-funded seats for the Army Wing by 12 Haryana Battalion NCC, Sonipat. Through a structured training programme comprising physical training, drill, academic instruction, leadership development, and personality enhancement, NCC cadets are groomed to become responsible citizens and potential future officers in the Armed Forces. The University's NCC cadets actively participate in prestigious national and regional camps and activities, including the Republic Day Camp (RDC), Youth Exchange Programme (YEP), Annual Training Camp (ATC), Thal Sainik Camp, Shooting Camps, trekking, and various adventure programmes, providing them with valuable exposure and experiential learning opportunities. Successful completion of training leads to the award of NCC 'B' and 'C' Certificates. **To date, more than 100 cadets have earned the NCC 'B' Certificate, while over 95 cadets have been awarded the prestigious NCC 'C' Certificate.** Additionally, holders of the NCC 'C' Certificate **are eligible for direct entry to the Services Selection Board (SSB) interview** under the Special NCC Entry Scheme for commissioning as officers in the Indian Armed Forces.

National Service Scheme (NSS)

The prestigious National Service Scheme (NSS) of the Government of India has been implemented by the University. The students are encouraged to enroll and participate in NSS which inculcates in them the spirit of social and national service. The enrolled students are awarded with a merit certificate which helps them in their career.

During the session 2024-25, the NSS volunteers of Bhagat Phool Singh Mahila Vishwavidyalaya organized various activities related to cleanliness, environmental protection, digital literacy, health awareness and social responsibility with the vision of “Viksit Bharat @2047”. Students must have minimum inter college participation/first / second /third position or senior state/district championship participation/ first / second /third position minimum qualification for being eligible for admission. OR Bachelor of Science (BSc.) in Health and Physical Education with at least 45% percent marks. Preference will be given to those candidates who are sportsperson or had participated in Inter-University and National level. No student who has crossed the age of 29 years as on 1st July of the relevant year will be allowed admission to M.P.E.S (Master of Physical Education and Sports) 2 years course. However, the vice-chancellor, BPSMV, has the power to relax the upper age limit by one year on the recommendation of the Head/ Incharge of the Department. The upper age limit may be relaxed by 3 years in the case of SC and ST candidates of Haryana. Submission of Physical fitness certificate from Institute of Ayurveda, BPSMV is compulsory before admission to the course.

No candidate who is in employment (whole-time, part-time, or honorary service) shall be eligible to take admission in M.P.E.S. programme without taking leave from her institution/ office etc. from the date of admission to the termination of Two year course. She has to submit an affidavit in this regard. If found in violation of this rule necessary action shall be taken against the candidate.

Note: Reservation will be followed as per Haryana State Government Rules only after qualifying the Physical Efficiency Test (PET) admission to M.P.E.S. course will be processed.

MARU SINGH MEMORIAL INSTITUTE OF AYURVEDA

The institute is supported by dedicated faculty members, well-equipped laboratories—including a dissection hall and a modern pathology laboratory—providing hands-on learning experiences. The library is well-stocked with over 12,500 classical and modern Ayurveda books and offers a student-friendly flexible schedule. 2. Admission Procedure

The admission to all the programmes will be made through ONLINE mode only. All enquiries pertaining to admission must be addressed to the concerned department/ Institute/Centre. The applicants should mention their aadhar number in the admission application form. For claiming any benefit under various initiatives of the State Govt., the candidate should fill up the correct **Parivar Pahchan Patra** (PPP ID) issued by the State Govt. of Haryana, if any

and also upload a copy of the same on the portal. The benefit shall however be subject to validation of PPP ID as per due procedure.

3. Exit Policy

The programmes are offered in accordance with the key recommendations of the NEP 2020 including the multiple entry-exit scheme. The details could be read in the applicable University's common ordinances prescribed for UG and PG academic programmes.

4. National Service Scheme

In order to inculcate among the students a sense of social consciousness and dignity of labor, the university has implemented National Service Scheme. 6. Credit Scheme

The university has successfully implemented the semester scheme in all its programmes. As part of this scheme, credits are allocated to each course and a cumulative result is derived at the end.

7. Placement Assistance

The university provides placement assistance to the meritorious students especially of the professional courses. The companies are invited to the campus for placement.

8. Attendance

The attendance of the students in the classes is closely monitored. A student falling short of 75% attendance in any programme will be barred from appearing in the final examination. However, genuine cases will be considered according to the existing statutes.

9. Scholarships

The University offers the following scholarships to the meritorious and needy students. The eligible and interested students shall contact the Registration & Scholarship branch of the University.

- Post Matric Scholarship for SC Students
- Post Matric Scholarship for BC Students
- Haryana State Merit Scholarship Scheme
- Promotion of Science Education (POSE) Scholarship Scheme
- University Research Scholarship is being provided to the Ph.D. Students of the University.
- In addition to the above, the University provides financial assistance to the poor & needy students out of the 'Charity Fund' of BPSMV, Khanpur Kalan.

10. Reservation & Concession

The reservation policy of the State Government of Haryana will be followed strictly for admission to all programmes. Every eligible SC student has to submit an undertaking as per attached certificate given in the prospectus.

11. Reservation in Different Courses for the Girls of Khanpur Kalan Village

- Two seats may be reserved in every course where the intake of student is 50. For instance graduation degree in the BPSIHL will be considered as one course irrespective of the combination of subjects.
- If during an admission, no eligible girl candidate is available in earmarked category for that year, the vacancy can be offered to the eligible girl candidate in the other reserved categories. If no candidate is available in any one of the reserved categories, the vacancy can be offered to general category of the village, and then it will revert to the open category of seats.

12. Reservation of Seats for the Natives of Bhainswal Kalan

- Only one seat in each course be reserved for the natives of Bhainswal Kalan who have donated land. Wherever numbers of seats are more than 50, then one seat will be increased for every block of 50. This seat will be filled up on rotation basis, starting from general category candidate and taking care of all the categories turn by turn.
- 100% concession in tuition fee in general programmes at PG level and professional programmes at UG/ PG level for those girls whose families have donated land for the university or whose land was acquired.

13. Special Seats for the Students of Jammu & Kashmir

- Two Supernumerary seats be allowed to the students of Jammu & Kashmir in every programme of the university.

14. Concession to the Kashmiri Migrant Students

- Relaxation in cut-off percentage up to 10% subject to minimum eligibility requirement
- Increase in intake capacity up to 5% course wise
- Reservation of at least one seat in merit quota in technical/professional institutions
- Waiving of domicile requirements

15. Fee Concession for the University Employees

The University employees/ their wards / spouses including the wards of retired employees & wards of employees who die while in service shall be entitled for following concessions:-

- Full tuition fee concession
- Three fourth ($\frac{3}{4}$) of the development fee

16. Admission against Vacant Seats

- If any seat remains vacant in sub categories of BC (A) & BC (B), the same will be filled up through the candidates belonging to other category. For example, if any seat in BC (B) category remains vacant, the same will be filled up from BC(A) category and vice-versa.
- If the candidates in the SC/ST category are not available and the seats still remain vacant, the same may be thrown open to Haryana open category with the approval of the Vice chancellor. In case, the seats in Haryana general category remain vacant at the end, the same will be thrown open to all India open category with the permission of the Vice Chancellor. However, if the candidate of SC/ST category approaches the university that she could not present herself at the time of physical presence on sufficient grounds and so reserved seat has been filled up from Haryana open category candidates, the proposal for additional seat (except professional courses in which seat can be increased only with the approval of the professional statutory councils) for that candidate, will be put up by the concerned department. This facility shall be restricted to SC/ST students only.

17. Other Rules & Guidelines Relating to Fee Structure

- The fee structure includes examination fee
- Tuition fee and other dues will be payable for 6 months i.e. (Semester wise)

18. Refund of Fee

- A. For the courses in which admission is granted directly by the university, refund of fee will be as following:
- Within a week of admission ` 1,000/- will be deducted.
 - Within a month of admission 25% of the total fee deposited will be deducted.
 - Beyond one month fee will not be refunded.
- B. For the courses in which admission is granted through Haryana State Counseling Society (HSCS) the refund of fee shall be as per the rules or guidelines of HSCS.
- C. Separate applications are to be tendered for refund of fee for course and hostel.

19. Fee Transfer

In the event of change of course/programme the fee deposited will not be refunded but can be transferred internally from one department to other with the prior approval of concerned Heads.

Copy of letter No. 1170-SW (I)-95 dated 7.6.95 received from the Commissioner & Secretary to Government, Haryana, Welfare of Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes Department, Haryana, Chandigarh, addressed to all Heads of Departments, Commissioners, Ambala, Hisar, Rohtak and Gurugram Divisions, all Deputy Commissioners & Sub Divisional Officers in Haryana and Registrar, Punjab and Haryana High Court, Chandigarh.

Sub: Exclusion of socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes.

Sir,

I am directed to invite your attention to the subject mentioned above and to state that following the Supreme Court judgment in the Indira Sawhney and others versus Union of India case, the Haryana Government vide notification dated 12.10.1993 had set up the Haryana Second Backward Classes Commission. The terms of reference of this Commission were to entertain, examine and recommend upon requests for inclusion and complaints of over-inclusion and under- inclusion in the list of Backward Classes. Vide notification dated 26-5-1994, the Commission was also assigned the function of specifying the basis, applying the relevant and requisite socio- economic criteria to exclude socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes.

In its report submitted on 16.5.1995, the Haryana Second Backward Classes Commission had recommended the criteria for excluding socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes. After considering these recommendations, the Government has decided that the benefit of reservation shall not apply to persons/sections mentioned in **Annexure "A"**, which is enclosed.

All the departments are requested to bring the above instructions to the notice of all the Heads of Departments and appointing authorities under their control for necessary compliance.

- a) parents both of whom are Class-II Officers.
 - b) parents of whom only the husband is a Class-I Officer and he gets into Class-I at the age of 40 or earlier.
 - c) parents, both of whom are Class-II officers and one of them dies or suffers permanent incapacitation and either one of them has had the benefit of employment in any International Organization like UN, IMF, World Bank, etc. for a period of not less than 5 years before such death or permanent incapacitation;
 - d) parents of whom the husband is a Class-I Officer (direct recruit or pre-forty promoted) and the wife is a Class-II officer and the wife dies or suffers permanent incapacitation; and
 - e) parents, of whom the wife is a Class I officer (Direct Recruit or pre-forty promoted) and the husband is a Class-II officer & the husband dies or suffers permanent incapacitation.

Provided that the rule of exclusion shall not apply in the following cases:
Sons and daughters of

- a) parents, both of whom are Class II officers and one of them dies or suffers permanent incapacitation.
- b) parents, both of whom are Class-II officers and both of them die or suffer permanent incapacitation, even though either of them has had the benefit of employment in any International Organization like UN, IMF, World Bank, etc. for a period of not less than 5 years before their death or permanent incapacitation.

C. The criteria enumerated in A & B above in this Category will apply *mutatis mutandi* to officers holding equivalent or comparable posts in PSUs, Banks, Insurance Organizations, Universities, etc. pending the evaluation of the posts on equivalent or comparable basis in these institutions, the criteria specified in Category V below will apply to the officers in these Institutions.

III Sons(s) and daughter(s) of parents either or both of whom is or are in the rank of Colonel and above in the army and to equivalent posts in the Navy and the Air Force and the Para Military Forces
Provided that -

- i. If the wife of an Armed Forces Officer is herself in the Armed Forces (i.e., the category under consideration), the rule of exclusion will apply only when she herself has reached the rank of Colonel;
- ii. the service ranks below Colonel of husband and wife shall not be clubbed together;
- iii. If the wife of an officer in the Armed Forces is in Civil employment, this will not be taken into account for applying the rule of exclusion unless she falls in the service category under item No. II in which case the criteria and conditions enumerated therein will apply to her independently.

IV Son(s) and daughter(s) of persons belonging to a family (father, mother and minor children) which owns land more than land permissible under the Ceiling Act of Haryana State

V Income/Wealth Tax

Son(s)/Daughter(s) of

- a) Persons having gross annual income of Rs. 6.00 lakhs or above or possessing

wealth above the exemption limit as prescribed in the Wealth Tax Act for a period of three consecutive years. (Range of income has been revised from Rs. 4.50 lakhs to Rs. 6.00 lakhs vide Chief Secretary letter No. 22/22/2004-3GS-III dated 06.01.2014/14.06.2016).

b) Persons in Categories I, II, III & IV who are not disentitled to the benefit of reservation but have income from other sources of wealth which will bring them within the income/wealth criteria mentioned in (a) above.

Explanation

- i) Income from salaries or agricultural land shall not be clubbed;
- ii) The income criteria in terms of rupee will be modified taking into account the change in its value every three years. If the situation, however, so demands, the interregnum may bless.
- iii) Where the husband is in some profession and the wife is in a Class II or lower grade employment, the income/wealth test will apply only on the basis of the husband's income.
- iv) If the wife is in any profession and the husband is in employment in a Class II or lower rank post, then the income/wealth criterion will apply only on the basis of the wife's income and the husband's income will not be clubbed with it.

Explanation: Wherever the expression, 'permanent incapacitation' occurs in this schedule it shall mean incapacitation which results in putting an Officer out of service.

Subject : Clarification regarding issuance of certificate of Haryana Backward Classes.

Sir,

I am directed to invite your attention to the Govt. of Haryana, Social Welfare Department letter No. 1170-SW (1) 95, dated 7.6.95 on the subject noted above, therein criteria was laid down to assess the creamy layer persons of Haryana Backward Classes in Haryana State. The Backward Classes of Haryana are facing difficulty in obtaining the Backward Classes certificate from the certificate issuing authority due to some understanding in the instructions dated 7.6.95. After careful consideration the Govt. of Haryana has decided to issue clear cut directions to all the Heads of Departments and Deputy Commissioners in the state for issuing Backward Classes Certificate without any further delay.

It is **clarified** that the income from salary will not be taken into account for the purpose of income/wealth tax in respect of service category and while calculating income or wealth **tax** of the Government employee of Backward Classes who is not covered under Annexure A, description of categories No. I, II (a,b,c,d) and III & IV, hence becoming entitled for the benefit of reservation under Backward Classes category, his salary should not be included but his other sources of income/wealth be included for income/wealth tax.

All the departments are requested to bring the above instructions to the notice of all the Head of Departments and appointing authorities under their control for necessary compliance.





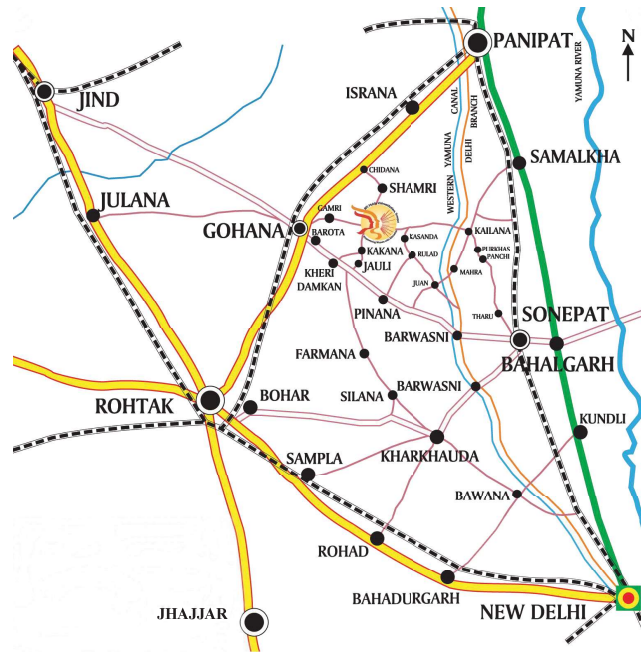
